





Welcome back...

Welcome back, we hope you have had an enjoyable holiday.

We would like to take this opportunity to kindly remind you of our school rules and expectations:

School Day: Please ensure that your child arrives at school on time each day. The class teacher will be waiting for the class at 8.45. Every morning begins with a reading session; if your child is consistently late, they will miss out on this vital learning opportunity.

Uniform: Children must come to school wearing the correct uniform. Only black, flat shoes are allowed, plain black trainers are acceptable. The correct PE kit must also be worn for PE and Games lessons (light blue Montem T-shirt, black or navy shorts or tracksuit bottoms) Children will no longer be allowed to wear designer sports wear. If your child wears a headscarf please ensure that it is plain black, white or navy.

Jewellery: Children should not wear any jewellery to school. Only small studs, a watch and items of religious importance are permitted.

Homework: It is very important that we work together so that your child can consolidate their skills at home. Please ensure that you encourage and support your child with their homework and hear them read every day. Once your child has read please ensure that their reading record is signed. Your child's book will not be changed otherwise. Project homework is compulsory and must be completed to a high standard. You are also invited to come and attend a lesson with your child every Wednesday, but this is based on a first come first served basis.

Attendance: It is vital that your child attends school every day in order for them to reach their full potential. The school's expectation for attendance is 96%.

** Supporting them whilst they learn their spelling words.


** Encourage them to retell some of their favourite stories. You could even create actions.

How you can help at home:


** Encourage children to use their number skills in everyday life e.g. during a trip to the supermarket.

Science

In Sciences this term, we shall be studying two topics. This half term, the focus will be Forces and Magnets. In this unit, children will:

Computing


In their computing lessons, children will often work in our specialist ICT suite. They will be focusing on:

History
