Reception: People, culture and communities Discussing the summer holidays and how to support peers after the break on return to school.

Year 1: RE: Islam- they may have different beliefs to our own but are important to Muslims. Tolerance of their religious celebrations and stories.

Year 3: Big Read -The Big Wave - set in Japan which will allow the children to explore and learn about a different background and way of life discuss different types of families

Year 4: PSHE: Changing me Understand and respect the changes that they see in other people

Year 5: PHSE - Children are tolerant of all body types and features.

Year 6: PSHE- As the children prepare to move on to secondary school, discuss with them how they will meet children from different backgrounds and who have different opinions to them which they may not agree with. Discuss how it is fine to disagree on issues but it is how we express ourselves which is most important.

Year 3: PSHE Responsibility to care for others.

Year 4: Geography: hurricanes - responsibility to be aware of and take steps to limit global warming.

Year 6: Big Reading- In The Firework -Maker's Daughter Lila does everything she can to try and protect her father from being executed by the King.

Year 3: Writing - Discussions about natural disasters whilst considering opinions of others.

Year 5: Big Reading - San was able to voice his feelings towards his friend even though he faced some prejudice.

Year 6: PE- Sports Day preparation. Whilst choosing events that the children will participate in on Sports Day, discuss with the children the importance of listening to each other and deciding as a team which member of the class should participate in a certain event/race.

Reception: The Natural World. Consider what clothing they have to wear in different weather conditions and during different seasons.

Year 4: Geography:/ Big Read I am responsible for my actions. Discussion about looting in the aftermath of a natural disaster

Year 5: PHSE - Children can express how they feel about puberty and the change to their bodies.
