Reception: Eid - children to learn about celebrations and places of worship.

Year 1: Judaism- they may have different beliefs to our own but are important to Jews. Tolerance of their religious celebrations and stories. Science: Living around

Year 2: Big Read - visiting different places all over the world and meeting characters. Tolerance for different characters from different places.

Year 3: Writing a descriptive setting based in Africa. They will explore different and diverse places and cultures around the world and they will be comparing them to our own lives and experiences. In Big Read Akimbo's adventures are set in Africa which will offer a new insight that the children may be unfamiliar with.

Year 4: Judaism: different celebrations, comparison with Christianity.

Year 5: Big Reading: How animals are tolerant of each other with habitats so they live harmoniously.

Year 6: Big Reading- Discuss how Hindus beliefs are perhaps different from ours.

Responsibility

Reception: Caring for animals - our pets, guinea pigs and chickens.

Year 1: PSHE diets and fitness focus. We have a responsibility to eat healthily and keep our body fit. Year 2: Responsibility

Year 3: Big Read: Responsibility to care for living things and protect others when they are unable to themselves- protecting the animals from the poachers.

Year 4: Geography: rainforests The importance of caring for our planet. Science: the importance of caring for ourselves digestive system and teeth. Big Read: The Explorer exposure of Amazon natives to diseases that they hadn't previously encountered.

Year 5: Big Reading - Sylvan the Vole has a responsibility to keep his siblings safe and find them a new home now that their mother has been taken by the predator.

> **Year 6:** Geography-Discuss with the children the importance of following rules when taking part in activities such as mountain climbing as not doing so can have adverse consequences and can impact on those around us. Big Reading- Discuss with the children how Ruby's Dad's activities with loan sharks has resulted in the family losing their home and having to go on the run.

> Year 6: PSHE- Discuss with the children how even though we have freedom of choice, sometimes our actions can have consequences. Discuss with the children the impact of behaviour such as drug use on not only ourselves but those around us.

Year 3: Big Read: Looking at different laws in other countries (poaching laws).
