

Year Five – Animal Kingdoms

This term, the pupils in year 6b have been learning about wolves. Our pupils thoroughly enjoyed researching and finding out more about the features of wolves, their habitats and how they hunt their prey. In science, pupils explored the features of wolves in depth and used their comprehension skills to find out why wolves are known to be such courageous animals. Pupils enjoyed learning facts and comparing wolf life cycles to that of human beings. As a result of all their fantastic findings, pupils created fact files whilst others wrote non - chronological reports on wolves and their lives.

In maths, pupils used coordinates to help reflect images of wolves and other Native American symbols. They also created 'treasure maps' to lead wolves to their wolf packs. It was great to see how enthused pupils were and the wealth of knowledge they gained from this cross curricular project.
